Executive Summary (1991-2006)

The VPP involves over 300 people contributing 500+ volunteer days per year across Victoria in Australia's largest private raptor conservation initiative.

Research mile stones

- Since 1991, 1,687 peregrine chicks banded = 60% of total ever in Australia
- 200 (12%) recoveries on chicks
- 100% recovery of adults that were banded as adults
- 95% of nest boxes producing chicks

Management mile stones

- Banksia Environmental Foundation Award Winner 1999.
- Strategies developed for managing eco-tourism (ie rock climbing)
- Power utilities adopting "raptor friendly practices"
- Ongoing advice service to industry on managing raptors
